

come to parents of Grade 4, 7, and 10 students, but have been known to come to parents of other


grades as well. This survey is important to our school division, and we value your honest feedback.

I would also like to take this time to highlight our achievements and to showcase some of the great things we've been implementing within the Division. We currently have a partnership with Grande Prairie Regional College for Trades Instruction — which is something we are very proud of. This initiative is making it easier for Grade 12 students to transition into fulfilling careers and pursue their academic dreams beyond high school. We have also had an increase in our 3-Year High School Completion Rate, which is an excellent accomplishment during a pandemic. Principals, teachers, and educational assistants have gone out of their way to support students and their collective hard work has paid off! In the Division, we are still sticking to our Literacy, Numeracy, and Inclusionary culture goals. We are working hard to ensure that all students are reading and writing at or above their grade levels or meeting their individualized program goals. Extra attention is also being given to ensuring that students are performing at or above grade level in numeracy and are confident in their mathematical abilities. The Division is also focused on inclusive learning for all students, and each school is ensuring a safe and caring environment that celebrates diversity. All schools are making sure that their students' physical, social, and emotional wellness needs are met so that their overall academic engagement is increased. I am also happy to announce that we are instituting the Learning Loss Intervention Program for Grade 1 to Grade 3 students. This initiative will be providing supports for students who may need extra assistance with literacy and numeracy and is being funded by the Alberta Government to close the gap on learning losses that have occurred due to the pandemic.

We are looking forward to a successful year ahead and we thank you all for your continued support.

Kindergarten News

December was filled with learning and joy as we learned about christmas and Christmas celebrations. The children created many crafts within the classroom, read many Christmas stories, and learned songs to help celebrate the season. We shared special family traditions with our classmates, and participated in discussions about how our families celebrate during Christmas.

This month we continue to learn about the seasons, and will take a closer look at the season of winter. We have some fun snow and ice explorations planned! We will have fun practicing building words using the letter sounds we have studied so far this year. We continue to work on our letter formation, and showcase our improved drawing skills in guided drawing. We will meet our sound friends Jenny Jaguar, Nelly Newt, Baby Barnaby and Gilda Goose.

Math we are working on number recognition and formation, making patterns using sounds and actions measuring and comparing objects Identifying 3D shapes and sorting them.















With the cold temperatures in early January we were stuck inside a lot and now have enjoyed getting outside and enjoying the snow. During our PE time we have been lacing up our skates and hitting the ice. Mr.O has been teaching us beginner skating skills, so that we are able to skate independently.







Grade 1/2/3



We are continuing to practice reading skills through daily small groups in class, as well as home reading. In writing we have been and will continue to focus on suspense and how to add this into our stories. As a class we are reading The Dragon Thief, this is the sequel to Dragons in a Bag that we read in October. We are very excited to find out what happens next, and may need to read the third book that is coming out in a few weeks.

In Social Studies we are learning about citizenship, how we can be good citizens and help care for our environment. We are also learning how to read and draw a maps, including legends and compasses.

Grade 1/2/3

We are learning about our 5
Senses and Hot and Cold
Temperatures in Science now.
Throughout both of these units we will be performing lots of experiments around both topics.
We will be completing our Exploring Liquids Unit we had been working on with Mrs.
Federowicz when she is back in February.

In Math we continuing to work on addition and will be moving in to subtraction. Grade 1 students are continuing to work with numbers to 20, Grade 2 students are working with numbers to 100, this means they are learning to regroup with addition and subtraction, and Grade 3 students are working with numbers to 1000, which means building on the regrouping they learned last year.











Grade 4/5/6



I cannot believe that we are already halfway through the school year already. Time can slow down any minute! This past while, students have been taking advantage of the beautiful days, and heading outside for gym. We have been loving Chickadee Ally, and taking all our moments to walk or snowshoe the trails. It is a wonderful and special place. I am a firm believer that students create deeper learning when connected to place and community.







During our Dynamite time before Christmas, students made the birds a special treat during the cold weather. Taking pine cones, peanut butter and bird seed, students created their own bird seed feeders and hung them on the walking trial.







In our ELA class we have been busy learning about writing letters. Students took great care to write Santa a letter before Christmas, and mailed it themselves at the Dixonville Post Office. They also have written letters to Great Aunt Gert, and responded to a Help Wanted advertisement.

Our grade 4/5/6 class have wrapped up their units in Science this past December. Grade six was very excited to learn their forensic unit, and attempted to solve the cold case of Who Killed Buddy. They are now flipped over into Social studies, learning about the Historical Democracy, and where it originated from.

Grade % wrapped up their unit on Electricity and Magnetism, and have also flipped over to their Social unit on Canadian Histories and Stories. They have been taking the time so far to learn about Indiginous Nations, and have even started Indigenous beadwork.



















Grade 7/8/9






Happy New Year!

The 7/8s create a 3-D Animal Cell Model to help learn about and understand the functions of a cell. All the models turned out super awesome!















The grade 9s have been hard at work, learning all about environmental chemistry! Topics that have been covered include testing pH, acid precipitation, and water and air quality.

After Christmas break, we continued with how to help prevent and counteract the damages done to the environment from human waste! After this topic will be our Unit B final exam!

Each student has been assigned a role, which they put lots of practice into! As they are learning more about their roles, the students are focusing on their tone of voice to match the character's mood and what they need to communicate about their feelings. They also worked on their speaking voice, projecting their voice loud for an audience to hear.







To start the new year, the students have started an independent novel study! They were able to choose their own books for this unit. As they read, they have checkpoints where they will complete an assignment based on important reading skills and strategies. At the end of their book will be a final project of their choice. I cannot wait to see all the different projects they come up with!
